Frank Walter: Music of the Spheres at Ingleby Gallery

A longed-for return to live performance is being celebrated this summer at the Edinburgh Festival. An accompanying visual arts programme features more than 35 exhibitions across the city. The most vivid promises to be Music of the Spheres, a show of works by the Antiguan-born artist Frank Walter, self-styled 7th Prince of the West Indies, Lord of Follies and the Ding-a-Ding Nook, who on his death in 2009 left an astonishing cache of 5,000 pictures, not to mention many thousands more pages of closely typed manuscript. Walter has become highly fashionable. But it was the Ingleby Gallery that first spotted his eccentric talent and it is staging what promises to be his most beautiful exhibition to date.
