

ALISON WATT

Watt's work first came to public attention in 1987 when she won the National Portrait Gallery's coveted annual award and in the late 1980s and early 90s she became well known for her paintings of figures, often female nudes, in dryly painted, light-filled interiors. Watt's exhibition *Fold* in 1997 at Edinburgh's Fruitmarket Gallery marked a turning point by introducing fabric alongside these figures, simultaneously suggesting a debt to the 19th century painter Ingres as well as pointing to the possibilities of abstraction. *Shift*, her exhibition at the Scottish National Gallery of Modern Art at the end of 2000, took these ideas a stage further still with 12 large works, each depicting swathes of fabric alone. Her exquisitely painted canvases continue to edge further towards abstraction yet suggest a human presence and an interest in the allure of negative space.

In 2008 Alison Watt had a solo show, *Phantom*, at The National Gallery, London presenting work produced during her time there as Associate Artist (2006-8) and was awarded an OBE in the same year. In 2014, as part of the Nationwide *GENERATION* programme of exhibitions celebrating 25 Years of Contemporary Art in Scotland, a retrospective exhibition of Watt's paintings was held at Perth Museum and Art Gallery, and a solo display at the Scottish National Gallery of Modern Art. Watt was commissioned to design a major tapestry - *Butterfly* - in collaboration with Dovecot studios and Scottish Opera 2015, and commissioned in 2018 to make a large scale painting for the permanent collection of the new American Embassy in London.
