

ANDREW MILLER

Andrew Miller is a Glasgow based artist working across a variety of media – drawing, sculpture, photography and site-specific installations. Through a process of altering, transforming and making, Miller seeks to gain an understanding of the ambiguity between notions of form and function. He works with the worn and the discarded, and in salvaging, reassembling and re-presenting familiar objects he asks questions about the way things are placed, valued and used. This serious and rigorous approach is underpinned by a light touch born of his obvious affection for the visual underdog – the jettisoned and the redundant.

Recent projects include a major solo exhibition *Dusk or Dawn*, at BALTIC|39, Newcastle; a collaborative and participatory artwork *No Meal is Complete Without Conversation* created for the 2012 Glasgow International festival and *The Waiting Place*; a specially designed pavilion commissioned for the 2012 Edinburgh Art Festival. In 2014 a significant display of Miller's work was presented in the exhibition *Counterpoint* at Talbot Rice Gallery, Edinburgh as part of *GENERATION*; the nationwide programme of exhibitions celebrating 25 years of contemporary art in Scotland.
